

» SHARED RECIPE

Elaine Longseth was known for bringing wonderful baked treats to our meetings . She brought these to a Model A Reunion, and gave Karlene the recipe. It is still a family favorite.

Sugar Cookies

- 1 Cup White Sugar
- 1 Cup Powdered Sugar
- 1 Cup Oil
- 1 Cup Butter

Mix together these ingredients, then add 2 beaten eggs, mix and stir together. Add 2 tsp Vanilla, mix and stir in..

- Mix and stir in:
- 3 1/2 Cups Flour
- 3/4 tsp Salt
- 1 tsp Baking Soda
- 1 tsp Cream of Tarter

Roll in balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Press down slightly, sprinkle with sugar. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes. May take a little less time depending on the ovens.

Note: Batter is soft, refrigerate when not panning cookies.

Plans are in the works to possibly make the Model A the feature car at the Iola Car Show in 2028, in celebration of it's 100th Anniversary. Will I get my license plate this time? The last time the Model A was the feature car for Iola was 2002, and was also the year that the 20 Millionth Ford, a 1931 Model A, was unveiled after being restored. I was the Webmaster for the Iola Car Show at that time.

With knowing a little Ford history, I knew that in 1931 the 20 Millionth Ford was being driven state to state as a Ford promotion. Each state would give the car their license plate with the number 20000000 to mark the occasion. Since in 2002, Wisconsin would be the first state that this restored Model A would be revealed at, and it was going on a tour of the states, I suggested the Car Show should do the same in 2002. Raise the bar for the other states.

They created a couple of plates, I was supposed to get one, it was my idea after all. It went instead to someone who manged to talk their way into it. Sometimes you are the fly, sometimes you are the windshield.


Remember, these are paid events for our club, but we need to have the correct number of cars to get paid. This is also a great chance for us to advertise our club to potential new members along the parade routes.
