



Model A Repair Shops

Radiator Repair

Finding someone to do repair work on vintage radiators is beyond difficult, most shops will look at the age of it, and suggest scrapping it and buying a new one. If they do attempt a repair, chances are they will put it through a pressure load meant for a modern vehicle, blow it up, and tell you that the radiator was too weak.

I have taken my radiator repairs up to Benson Radiator, in Merrimac, WI. Emery, the owner, has years of experience working on radiators. The repairs are done in his shop at his house.

If you stop by his place, be sure to see his restored 1929 Buick Fordor Sedan (with original interior) and the Graham Brothers truck. Both works of art.


Monthly update from MARC's Tom Hovetter, President and Jim Zimmer, Director of Regions
