<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Secretary Joni Singer reported the May 8^h 2024 meeting minutes were sent out in the June Muffler newsletter and posted on the clubhouse bulletin board. There is also has a forge shop to work on blacksmithing projects. Luke is currently the new owner and bought the business from Wally Doran. Luke is in the process of restoring a 1913 Maxwell car. The building next door was originally a Maxwell car dealership.

After the hardware store tour we went over to the Waupaca Train Depot. The Depot has been restored to its original condition after sitting vacant and being vandalized over many years. Mike Kirk worked on the restoration and former RR employee, gave us a detailed story of the history of the depot. In one of the out buildings there is an old Waupaca Trolley car on display. I never knew that Waupaca had a

Trolley. There is also a couple of other train cars on display. In the basement of the depot there is a model train layout that is very large and meticulously detailed. They are recreating the train lines and surrounding buildings that are in the area.
