Change to read - "The membership anniversary date will start to accrue the same year a member joins the club and continue thereafter with paid membership due".


Reasoning- This will help to clarify the anniversary dates.







### Auto Wash Bowl - Car Wash History



#### What is an auto wash bowl?

It was patented in 1921 by inventor CP Bohland, who opened two branches in St. Paul. He invented the bowl as an easy way to remove mud from the bottom of cars. During this time, roads were often unpaved and muddy and the mud would get stuck on the bottom and on wheels. It not only cleaned the mud and manure (still a lot of horses using the roads) but also retightened the wooden spokes in the wheels as they would dry out & shrink.

When the idea proved successful in St.Paul, Bohland began advertising in other cities to franchise his Wash Bowl. The first branch outside of St. Paul was Chicago. After seeing its success in St. Paul, a Chicagoan named C.G. Burkhartsmeier bought the rights in 1924 and the first Auto Wash Bowl and service station was built in Chicago by the Newway Auto Cleaning & Service Corp. at a cost of \$20,000. The photo above is from 1924 and shows a newfangled type of car wash that stood at the northwest corner of 42nd Street and South Michigan Avenue.

The nearly 80-foot-wide, ribbed concrete bowl was approximately 16 inches at its deepest point. Customers paid 25 cents to a clerk who tied a protective rubber cover over the radiator. The cars entered the bowl via a ramp and then drove in circles in the basin at a speed of approximately 10 mph per hour. The ridges in the concrete would vibrate the car and the water, creating a sloshing motion that helped wash all the mud off the chassis and wheels. The process took about 5 minutes. After leaving the bowl, customers could opt for a complete wash. In one of the bays (similar to a wash box) the rest of the car was cleaned. On a busy Saturday, about 75 cars per hour went through the wash basin.

But, the Auto Wash Bowl ended up as little more than a novelty. Car-washing technology evolved, and just two years later, the North Side wash bowl was bought by a local realtor and the South Side wash bowl was gone by the 1930s.

A piece of history – the advertisement for the sale of Auto Wash Bowl franchises:

Come On In The Water's Fine

A five-minute trip through the automobile wash bowl removes all dust, dirt and mud from the wheels, spokes, fenders and running board. The turning action of the water in the bowl is a natural cleaning action. The whirling motion produces a gentle spray that loosens the grime and dirt without injury to the paint. Every car owner enjoys his drive through the Bowl.

The automobile washbowl at Saint Paul, Minnesota, built by the originators of this modern method for cleaning cars, has attracted the attention of business men and women throughout the United States. Business magazines have featured it as the sensation of the year. The motoring public has acknowledged its practical advantages — Its decided improvement over the old method. They demand more bowls because a car wash by this method is 50% to 75% more economical! In Saint Paul, for instance, one bowl has proved inadequate. As high as 300 cars have been put through the Bowl in one day, and then we were forced to turn many away.

Effective immediately, we will establish these Bowls in every State and City in the union. The city of Chicago — a virgin field — offers unlimited possibilities to men and women who

are in position to finance the building of these Bowls. The rights to build these bowls, covered by broad patents, are sold outright to the owner. Only a very nominal overhead is required to operate the bowl.

Further particulars will be gladly furnished to interested parties. Investigate NOW!

(Pam Gillet, from Wi Chapter, "A" Road to Good Cooking)

2 (3oz.) pkg. cream cheese, 1 (6 oz.) can frozen limeade Softened con-

centrate, thawed

1 1/2 c. milk 1 (8oz.) container whipped topping, thawed

1 pkg. vanilla instant pudding/pie 1 graham cracker crust

filling

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese at medium speed until smooth. Beat in 1/2 cup of milk. Reduce mixing speed to low and add pudding mix (undiluted), limeade concentrate and the remaining milk. Beat until blended. Fold in the whipped topping. Spoon mixture into the prepared graham cracker crust. Refrigerate pie until firm enough to slice, at least 4 hours.


The clutch worked then broke down about 12 miles from the Cooper's. Thanks to Dave Walczak, he was able to drive the car safely into the Cooper's garage.




